New Training Vessel for Mass Maritime Academy

The *Empire State*, the first of five new purpose, modern training vessels for America's state maritime academies was delivered to MARAD and will serve SUNY Maritime College. The new vessel program – known as National Security Multi-Mission Vessels (NSMVs) – was designed to provide world-class training for America's future and to support humanitarian assistance and disaster relief missions in times of need. The next training vessel, NSMV II, is scheduled to be delivered to Mass Maritime in 2024.

The NSMV program is an important investment in America's shipbuilding industry, which supports nearly 400,000 U.S. jobs. Each NSMV will feature numerous instructional spaces, a full training bridge, and accommodations for up to 600 cadets to train in a first-rate maritime academic environment at sea. State maritime academies graduate officers who manage vessels that help keep cargoes and our economy moving. Many of these merchant mariners also support U.S. national security by crewing military sealift vessels.
