AWARDS

Awards are being presented to outstanding Navy and Coast Guard personnel within their commands based on COVID-19 restrictions. These include USS Constitution Sailor of the Year, swords to Midshipmen at Mass Maritime and Holy Cross Brown U.), and Coast Guard Base Cape Cod, MSST Cape Cod, Sector Boston, USCGC Spencer, and several N&MCJROTCs. Several other awards are pending.

Virtual SEA-AIR-SPACE

One day's presentation addressed the worldwide responsibilities and presence of the **Coast Guard** and we learned that among the many tasks for which the Coast Guard is responsible is its enforcement of fisheries agreements, much of which affects the economic and security of nations dependent upon the sea.

Illegal, Unreported and Unregistered (IUU) fishing represents up to 26 million tons of fish annually, valued at 10 to 23 BILLION U.S. DOLLARS. It occurs on the high seas and within national jurisdiction affecting coastal populations in vulnerable areas. It is sometimes associated with other crimes. IUU threatens sustainable species by overfishing certain areas, catching undersized and protected species, which will limit those populations available for future harvesting.

NEW FFG CONTRACT AWARDED

The Navy awarded a contract to design and produce the next generation small surface combatant, the Guided Missile Frigate (FFG(X)) today. The contract calls for detail design and construction (DD&C) of up to 10 Guided Missile Frigates (consisting of one base ship and nine option ships) was awarded to Marinette Marine Corporation (MMC) of Marinette, Wisconsin (A subsidiary of Italian Fincantieri).

Based on a Franco-Italian design, European Multi-Mission Frigate variants of which are in service with the Italian, French, Egyptian, and Moroccan navies, it will include U.S. Navy specific hardware enabling multi-mission capability to conduct air warfare, anti-submarine warfare, surface warfare, electronic warfare, and information operations.

The new ship is designed to both integrate with, and complement, the carrier strike group and operate as a distributed node in a sensor network; and survivability while keeping the ship affordable and as a part of a 'high-low' mix of surface ships."



Gelsthorpe received his Surface Warfare Officer insign Peter Commanding Officer CDR Chris Norris, during a ceremony held onboard USS James E. Williams (CG 95), a guided missile destroyer, currently deployed in the Persian Gulf.

USS James E. Williams (DDG 95) is an Arleigh Burke-class guided-missile destroyer named in honor of Chief Boatswain's Mate James E. Williams, one of the Navy's most highly decorated enlisted sailors. Guided-missile destroyers are multi-mission surface combatants capable of conducting anti-air warfare, anti-submarine warfare, and anti-surface warfare.
