## Navy League LEGISLATIVE SUCCESS!

## Navy League secured multiple victories for the sea services in FY2018 Budget. Below are 2017 and 2018 actions. Your emails and letters were important.

### Navy League Recommended: Repeal Budget Control Act

The Budget Control Act caps were raised for FY18 and FY19 by almost \$300 billion.

Navy League Recommended: Grow the USN fleet to 355 ships; USMC needs 38 amphibious ships

The 355-ship Navy goal was codified in law in the FY18 NDAA, including a requirement for 38 amphibious ships. The Shipbuilding & Conversion budget approved over \$20B in FY17 and FY18, breaking historical norms. Included additional amphibious ship for USMC.

Navy League Recommended: Investment in Readiness

Increased funding for Navy and USMC aircraft, spares was included.

Navy League Recommended: ACI (Acquisition, Construction and Improvements) budget of at least \$2B/year for USCG \$2.7B in ACI funding in FY18 was passed.

Navy League Recommended Six Coast Guard Fast Response Cutters per year

Six Fast Response Cutters in FY17, FY18 were approved.

Navy League Recommended: Increased Hurricane Supplemental funds for the Coast Guard

Hurricane response was funded at \$411.1M over the request; nearly double original.

Navy League Recommended: Fund National Security Multi-Mission Vessel

FY18 was funded and FY19 Funding requested for NSMMV training ships at \$300M each. For the Maritime

Administration Reserve Fleet to train Merchant Marine Officers at the academies.

Navy League Recommended: Fund Maritime Security Program at \$300M/year

\$300M was fully funded for Maritime Security Program in FY17 and FY18.

### Navy League Recommended: Protect the Jones Act

Four anti-Jones Act bills were defeated in 2017.

In the small world of the Coast Guard, Rear Admiral Tiongson was the Commanding Officer of USCGC JAMES (WMSL 754) which our council assisted in commissioning in Boston in 2015.
