SEA CADET TRAINING – rates a rousing BRAVO ZULU (Navy signal meaning "WELL DONE")

A report from Master Chief Barry Crawford (Ret), Commanding Officer, Squadron 7-Zulu:

"I would like to report that we had an extremely successful weekend aboard the USS Salem. Our inaugural event dubbed "Operations Salem" involved Squadron 7 Zulu and Mass Bay Division, 25 Cadets and 10 adult volunteers, 1 overnight, 4 meal periods, and one 21,000 ton Heavy Cruiser.

There were no actual deaths or injuries to report, but (after a full day of quality training) we did have 10 (simulated) casualties during a training exercise in which a hostile boat unloaded a terrorist aboard the ship before exploding and punching a hold in the ships hull below the water line.

This exercise taught the Cadets how to manage ship operations through a custom computer simulation program requiring five divisions to communicate and work together to navigate into open waters, to defend the ship against hostile aggressors, to save the flooding ship after an explosion, fight fires, and save lives of those insured from the explosion.

This was very effective training for the Cadets and a good time was had by all! We hope to do this again in the future with a lot more participants and other units.

Special thanks go out to LTjg Mike Munger and his exceptional simulator program and security training team; INST Frank San Severino and his team of makeup artists and fire department support; and INST James Bodell and the crew of the USS Salem for their incredible support. The rest of our outstanding team of leaders, ensured Cadets were fed, safe, and involved in executing this mission and I commend all of you as well for your outstanding efforts.
